The Volunteer Center's Bay Area Corporate Volunteer Council (BACVC) engages businesses in supporting the nonprofit sector through employee volunteering and advises them on how to tie those efforts to their philanthropic goals, corporate social responsibility strategies and business success.

United Business Media LLC is thrilled to share the success of the Everything Channel Events team's XChange '09 from August 17-20 in Washington, D.C. In partnership with the nonprofit organization, The Framsyn Initiative, which identifies students in underserved communities who've expressed an interest in technology and technology careers. Twenty students between the ages of 15 and 17 from the states of North Carolina; New York; Maryland; Washington, D.C. and Iowa were selected to participate. Thanks to sponsorship/funding provided by Microsoft, the students were provided with transportation to the event (some flying for the first time!), rooming, meals and vouchers for their first set of technical certification exams.

Thanks to the generous donations of Microsoft, Intel, Samsung, and other technology manufacturers, the students had an opportunity to build their own computer systems and in effect, built the very computer lab they would be training in! During the course of the event, the students attended the IBM, HP and Microsoft world premier addresses, a general session on the relevance of social media in business and an IPED session that focused on the growth opportunities in a down economy. Several of our solution provider/system builder attendees joined the system-building session offering their help, experience and guidance. One student was proud to share that he had collected more than 100 business cards, and several were linking in, on facebook and twittering with new mentors and contacts.

Our first Future Tech Leaders program was an overwhelming success and many, many, MANY vendors and solution provider attendees asked how they can help and support the initiative.
