Volunteering Before a Disaster

Many people love to volunteer, especially after a large scale disaster. After the 1989 Loma Prieta



community agencies responding to disaster

Earthquake, for example, hundreds of people rolled up their sleeves and assisted the fire department. In 2005, people from all over the United States traveled to New Orleans to help with that community's recovery from Hurricane Katrina.

Most people volunteer for response organizations post-disaster, which is fantastic. But those same organizations could really use support and assistance before a large disaster or even when a minor emergency takes place, because many nonprofits and faith-based organizations deal with everyday emergencies. These emergencies are rarely broadcast on the nightly news, but they require support and would benefit from volunteer involvement. Did you know that the American Red Cross of the Bay Area responds to house fires throughout the Bay Area? While on scene, American Red Cross volunteers offer aid to newly displaced residents with meal vouchers or lodging accommodations.

The fact is, volunteering before a disaster or for an everyday emergency makes a big impact within an organization and provides much-needed support, so when a large scale emergency or disaster takes place that organization is in a much better position to respond. Volunteering before a disaster allows you the opportunity to receive free training, sharpen your disaster response skills and allows the organization you're volunteering for time to prepare.

For the fourth year in a row, volunteers from Franklin Templeton Investments participated in Jumpstart's Read for the Record, the world's largest shared reading experience. Each year, Jumpstart hosts this event to unite our communities and encourage children and adults to read the same book together on the same day.

Through Involved, Franklin Templeton's employee volunteer program, 48 volunteers received training in Jumpstart's dialogic reading technique and read to 180 preschool and kindergarten students in two schools in San Mateo. This year's

special campaign book was Eric Carle's classic, **The Very Hungry Caterpillar**.

One FTI volunteer shared, "It absolutely made my day - seeing how excited the students were that we were there. The event really encourages them to read and get involved in the story."

Over one million children were read to during this year's Read for the Record. The event raises awareness and funds to support Jumpstart's valuable early childhood literacy programs in underserved communities across the United States, including right here in the Bay Area.

Franklin Templeton CEO Greg Johnson (see photo) even joined in the fun. "Jumpstart is making a tremendous difference in children's lives each and every day, while also helping to train future teachers," said Johnson. "This was the fourth year that Franklin Templeton's Involved volunteers have participated in Read for the Record, and year-after-year, everyone raves about the experience and the critical purpose it serves. I had a great time reading with my students."



In total, over 550 students in the San Mateo - Foster City Elementary School District participated in Read for the Record and received a copy of the book for their home library, courtesy of Franklin Templeton Investments.
